## From the Principal

On Thursday we said farewell to Year 9 students as they made their way to visit significant Australian landmarks in **Canberra**, experience some of the wonders that Sydney offers and embrace the beauty of the snow at *Kosciuszko*. We wish the students, Mr Lees and his staff, Mr Murray, Mr & Mrs Walker, Ms Pearce, Ms Harrison, Miss Melia and Mr Newick a safe, healthy and happy tour.

I wish all Year 10 students enjoyment and learning as they engage in their week of work experience. We acknowledge the work Mrs Taylor has undertaken in preparing for the work experience opportunity. I do hope that all students take the opportunities with both hands and gain from the experience so it might be a formative guide to future career directions.

Next week is **Arts' and Artists' Focus for Years 3 to 8** on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Students are to wear their sports uniform. **Congratulations to Catherine Pearce on receiving** The Western Australian Institute of Educational Research (WAIER), an award given each year for the top post graduate research paper from each of the five WA Universities. Ms Pearce has been chosen for Murdoch University and has been invited to do a half hour presentation of her thesis at their yearly forum, being held at ECU Mt Lawley on Saturday 1 August, at which time she will also receive her award.

**Year 10 Courses 2010**

At the information session at the School on Tuesday 23 June, students were given non-core courses to choose from so that a course grid could be assembled. All data assembled from the student cohort will produce a grid that caters for the students, and allows us to staff courses appropriately. I am confident that student choices will reflect a strong demand for specific learning areas.

The grid will be formulated so that the courses with the greatest demand are not placed against each other in competition. This allows students their first preference selections in most cases.

Students will now need to allocate choices. Student numbers in course areas will now assist us in the facilitation of resources. Students will need to indicate their preferences as outlined on the 2010 Non-Core Selection Form. All forms need to be signed and dated by a parent/guardian. Course selection forms are to be returned to the School **on or after 31 July** to allow for the formalisation of the Year 10 Grid.

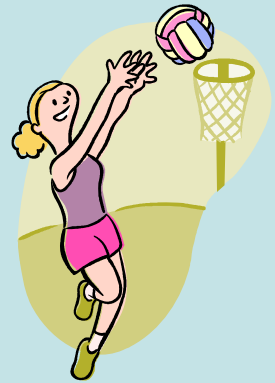

**Second Hand Uniform Sales**

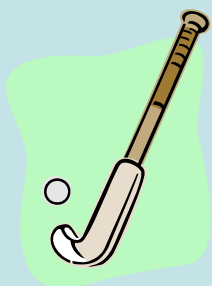
