Ringtail Possums

On Monday we had a visit from Gene Hardy from GeoCatch and Uta Wicke from The Possum Centre in Busselton. We learnt about a local species of possum, the Ringtail Possum. We were surprised to hear that the Ringtail Possum is considered a vulnerable species. If they continue to die out as they are now, they are expected to be extinct in ten years. Uta taught us about the lifestyle and food of the possum. Ringtail Possums live exclusively in Peppermint Trees and can feed off the leaves their whole life; in fact 95% of their diet is Peppermint leaves. When Ringtails eat Peppermint leaves they poo it out and eat it again. They do this because the poo still has a lot of nutrients in it. In this way they can save Peppermint leaves and still get the nutrients they need. Ringtails build a nest called a drey which is the size and shape of a football. It has two entrances/exits so if a predator comes in one end, the Ringtails can run out the other end. Gene and Uta also told us how we can help save the Ringtail Possums and their habitat. They told us that we can go and plant Peppermint Trees and make a habitat for the Ringtails; we can protect their environment that they already live in. A special surprise, at the end Uta brought in a real baby Ringtail Possum. It was really cute!



On Monday evening, we met together in the GMAS car park and went spotlighting in the bush near Provence. We managed to see three Ringtail Possums in the trees but we did see more scats so we know there are more possums living in that environment.

On Friday, the Year 6 students will be working with Gene Hardy to plant Peppermint Trees in the bush near Provence to enrich the habitat of the Ringtail Possum. We hope the Ringtail Possum population increases.

Australian Mathematics Competition

Earlier in the year, our top mathematicians were invited to take part in the Australian Mathematics Competition. As with last year, our results were very encouraging, with most year groups achieving higher than the state average for the competition. Sixty five Junior School students competed this year, compared to thirty three in 2008. Numbers competing in the Secondary School were slightly down due to the Year 7 small cohort. Year 5 was the best year group as a whole, between them averaging 3.1% above the state average.

There were several outstanding individual performances, most notably **Hayden Beynon** in Year 8 who again was ranked in the 100th percentile, placing him in the top 1% of students in the competition. This earned him our only High Distinction for the year. For the second year running **Alec Disley** won the Prudence Award for the most consecutive correct answers.

Our top students in each year group were: **Emma Kirkham** (Yr 3), **Casey Triplett** (Yr 4), **Eric Van Der Westhuizen** (Yr 5), **Ryan Hopkins** (Yr 6), **Caitlin Telford** (Yr 7), **Hayden Beynon** (Yr 8), **Alec Disley** and **Luka Cluff** (Yr 9) and **Dylan Ness** (Yr 10).

Our top student by percentile were: **Hayden Beynon** (100), **Chloe Carter** (98), **Ryan Hopkins** (97), **Alec Disley**, **Luka Cluff** and **Caitlin Telford** (95).

Eighteen students across the School achieved Distinctions, placing them in the top 15% for their year group. Considering the competition now includes more than forty countries around the globe, this is a very significant achievement. Certificates will be given out during assembly next term when they arrive.

In all I am very pleased, not only by these excellent results, but more so by the manner in which our students chose to approach the competition and gave their best on the day. I congratulate all students who took part and thank the staff who gave up their time to make it happen.

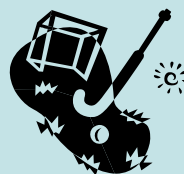
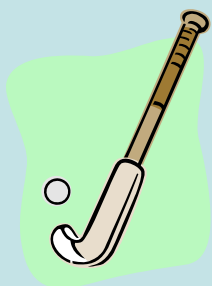
