When GMAS students wear the School Uniform, they are showing the community they represent our values:

Inclusion, Respect, Accomplishment and Spirituality



The School Uniform Guidelines have been developed in consultation with members of the School Community, including students. The school uniform plays an important part in supporting the schools' values and in establishing a sense of belonging. We aim for the uniform to be contemporary, inclusive and comfortable along with providing a positive Georgiana Molloy Anglican School community identity that supports students in understanding appropriate guidelines.

Acceptance of enrolment at Georgiana Molloy Anglican School assumes an agreement between the parent/guardian and the student that the student will dress in accordance with the school's uniform guidelines. Students are required to wear the school uniform during the school day, including to and from school and on school sanctioned tours, excursions or activities, as required. Every student is expected to comply with the uniform standards in the same way that they are required to comply with the expectations regarding classroom behaviour and attendance. All issues relating to the uniform will be directed to the class/home room teacher or designated staff member in management, who will have the final adjudication.



Students are expected to take pride in their personal appearance, to be neatly attired and well groomed. The following guidelines are provided to assist with overall uniform standards.

- Summer uniform is to be worn in Term 1 and 4. Winter uniform is to be worn in Term 2 and 3.
- Students enrolled at Georgiana Molloy Anglican School are expected to purchase official uniform items as displayed in the uniform shop and adhere to the school uniform standards.
- Student uniform must be neat, clean, ironed and in good repair at all times.
- Students are expected to wear the uniform in the intended manner. Accessories to the uniform are not acceptable.
- Students should not wear any visible garment showing underneath the school uniform. Students may wear a plain white short-sleeved undershirt or singlet. This item should not be visible.
- Two styles of school shirt are available to students; the fitted shirt is designed to be untucked, the formal shirt is designed to be tucked in at all times.

- The school shirts are currently under review.
- All items of clothing, including undergarments, must be modest and appropriate.
- Students are to wear the school blazer or jumper as part of the winter uniform. Alternate over garments are not acceptable. No other outer garments are permitted at school, unless permission has been granted by a senior staff member.
- Plain black leather shoes must be low heeled, free of logos and coloured stitching, clean and in good repair are to be worn.
- All items of clothing must be marked with the student's name.
- Physical Education and Outdoor Education students are permitted to wear the Physical Education uniform to and from school, on days when they have Physical Education first or last period of the day. At all other times students must change into their relevant uniform.
- Students who have more than one class requiring Physical or Outdoor Education attire may remain in that attire for the duration of the day.

Hair

- Hair (including facial hair) should be neat, clean, of a natural colour and well presented.
- Hair which is shoulder length or longer must be tied up and off the face. Hair accessories should be navy, teal, white or neutral colour tones.
- Hair must be no shorter than a number 2 clip (including undercuts) and no longer than collar length if untied.
- Patterns and shapes are not to be cut into hair.

Skirt Length, Shirts and Ties

- Pants and skirts need to be at a professional length.
- Ties are to be worn in a professional manner.

School Jumper/Sports Jacket

- The school jumper may be worn with the summer and winter uniform.
- The sports jacket may be worn as a layer in Terms 1 and 4, in a neat and tidy manner. The blazer is worn by secondary students in Terms 2 and 3.
- In Primary School the sports jacket can be worn in Terms 2 and 3 over the school jumper.
- In Secondary School the sports jacket cannot be worn in Terms 2 and 3 except if worn as part of the House and PE uniform.
- The school jumper fabric is currently under review.

Year 12 Leavers Jacket

- The Leavers Jacket is an optional uniform item.
- These can be worn by Year 12 students at receival.
- · Leavers Jackets cannot be worn to formal events.

Year 6 'Moving On' Shirt

 The Year 6 Moving On shirt can be worn during specialist PE lessons each week, or as directed by the Head of Primary School.

Jewellery, Make-up and Nail Polish

- Earrings can be studs or plain sleepers.
- · Only two earrings to be worn in each ear.
- Visible piercings not within the ear (e.g. dermal anchors, nose) are not permitted.
- Single plain jewellery is permitted, including a Medic Alert chain/bracelet.
- · Nail polish or make-up in natural tones may be worn.

Excursions/Tours

 Students representing the school on tours, excursions, competitions and events are required to ensure the uniform is worn to the highest standard unless advised by the staff in charge.

Formal Events

- Primary Nativity / Presentation Evening: Students from Kindy to Year 6 are to wear the seasonal uniform.
- Secondary Valete / Presentation Evening: Students from Year 7 to 12 are to wear seasonal uniform and blazers are required.
- Winter uniform is required for representation at special events and at other requested times.

Calendared "Casual for a Cause" Days

- On these days, students are not required to wear their school uniform.
- Students are permitted to wear their own choice of clothing, however all attire must still be appropriate for school.
- Offensive or inappropriate clothes (images that promote alcohol or other drugs, offensive slogans, picture or language) are not to be worn.
- Shoes must be worn and cannot include open back or excessively high heeled shoes.



SCHOOL SHOES

Students in Early Childhood are able to wear sports shoes or sandals. Students from Years 3-12 are required to wear black leather school shoes. Exceptions can be made for medical and health reasons. Medical evidence (such as a letter from a medical practitioner) will be required. All students are required to wear sports shoes for PE classes, sports events and co-curricular sporting activities.



Uniform Shop Location


The **One World Uniform Shop** is located near the Year 1 and 2 classrooms. Parents may purchase all uniform requirements, except shoes, from the Uniform Shop. Items can also be ordered online at www.gmasuniformshop.com.au and collected from Student Services.

The Uniform Shop is open every **Tuesday and Thursday** during term time, between **8.15am and 4.15pm** (closed for lunch 11.30am to 12.30pm).

During school holidays the Uniform Shop may open to accommodate any purchases required before the start of the new term. Opening times will be advertised on the school website.

Walk-ins are welcome during opening hours. Appointments can be made by emailing uniformshop@gmas.wa.edu.au or calling 9752 5204.

There are a small number of non-uniform items that are required to be purchased by families, such as the GMAS backbag, library bag and sports bag. The Uniform Shop will be able to advise what is required, depending on the student year level. There are a range of optional items that can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. These include the GMAS duffel bag, umbrella, scarf and hair accessories.



Lost Property

Students are responsible for their uniform items. Clothing and belongings should be named. Students should check Lost Property (located on the western wall outside the staff room) if an item is misplaced or goes missing. Unlabelled items are donated or disposed of. The school accepts no responsibility for items not claimed at the end of each term.



Uniform Exemptions

Students who for any reason are unable wear the complete and correct uniform must supply a note of explanation, from their parents, to their Home Room or Class Teacher.

If the correct uniform cannot be worn due to a medical condition, the student is required to have a medical certificate.

The parent/carer must contact the teacher before the student arrives at school. Some uniform items are available from Student Services for use, however, must be returned in clean condition within 3 days. Students who attend GMAS attired incorrectly on a consistent basis, without an acceptable explanation, will receive an appropriate sanction and may be removed from studies until the situation is rectified. Parents/Carers will be contacted and required to address the situation.

In matters of dispute regarding uniform appearance and hairstyles, the Principal's ruling will be final.





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
