### **TUITION FEES**

Tuition fees are billed in one annual invoice which is sent to families in early-February 2023. Payment is required by Monday 20 February 2023 unless an alternative payment arrangement is made. Tuition fees do not include the cost of textbooks, stationery, uniforms, co-curricular activities or instrumental music lessons.

### RESOURCE LEVIES

Resource levies cover the cost of student resources, excursions, elective subjects (with the exception of Physical Education and Outdoor Education), photocopying and general consumable resources whilst learning.

### **HOW TO PAY**

School fees may be paid by the following methods:

**Direct Debit/Credit Card Arrangements:** as per payment dates above.

**EFT bank transfer:** Fees can be paid electronically to the following account: BSB: 706001, Account: 30003692 using the account code as the reference.

**BPAY:** Fees can be paid by BPAY. Reference codes can be found on the annual statement.

**EFTPOS**: Fees can be paid via credit/debit card at the School Office or by telephone.

Cash: GMAS moved to a cashless system in 2022.

**Cheque:** Cheques can be made payable to Georgiana Molloy Anglican School and can be received by post or via the School Office in person.

The School's preferred method of payment is by **Direct Debit.**The annual school fee statement will display instalment options for payment.

### ADDITIONAL CHARGES

There are a number of additional charges that families should take into account. These will be detailed on each family's annual statement.

### APPLICATION & ENROLMENT FEES

A one-off application fee of \$75 (including GST) is payable in order to apply for enrolment. The fee is non-refundable and is designed to cover administration costs associated with enrolments. Please note that the payment of this fee does not guarantee enrolment. Confirmation of enrolment is dependent upon a school interview and payment of a one-off non-refundable enrolment fee which is a contribution towards existing buildings and educational facilities. Payment of the enrolment fee secures your child's place at GMAS and cannot be offset against tuition fees. The enrolment fee is payable at the time a confirmed place is offered. The fee consists of \$750 for the first child, \$150 for the second child and \$100 for the third child, to a maximum of \$1,000 per family.

### CAMPS (IGNITE PROGRAM)

GMAS is committed to providing students with an exceptional outdoor education experience, including through our camp program (Ignite Program) which runs across Kindy - Year 12. Year group camps are a compulsory component of the school's overall program. Camps are held in Term 1. As camps are funded on student numbers, no refunds will be given.

### SCHOOL BUILDING FUND

Separate to the compulsory school building levy, the school operates a building fund for voluntary contributions over and above the levy paid by all families. Any donations made are likely to be tax deductible, however we encourage you to seek your own advice. The fund raises money for future building programs designed to enhance the student experience at GMAS.

### Tee assistance

### **FAMILY CONCESSION**

When a family has two or more siblings attending the school at the same time, tuition fees are discounted by 10% for the second student and 20% for each subsequent student from the same family. This discount only applies to students in K-12.

### CONCESSION CARD HOLDERS

Parents/legal guardians in possession of a current concession card (Centrelink Health Care card, Pensioner Concession Card or Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card) are eligible for a 50% reduction in tuition fees. The card holder must be the parent/legal guardian of the student/s while they remain enrolled. Please contact the Bookkeeper for more information.

### SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME (YRS 7-12)

The Department of Education offers an allowance to assist eligible families with the cost of secondary schooling. The allowance is payable to holders of Family Health Care Cards (not student cards), a Pensioner Concession Card, or Veterans Affairs Card. If approved, the Department will pay \$115 directly to parents to assist with the purchase of uniforms and textbooks. \$235 is paid directly to the school to offset the school fee account. Application forms are available from the School Office and must be submitted by 6 April 2023.

### FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

Families who are experiencing temporary financial hardship are encouraged to contact our Bookkeeper to discuss how the school may assist. Options may include entering into a payment plan/arrangement or fee remission (in extreme circumstances).

### UNIFORMS

Students are required to wear the GMAS school uniform. Uniforms are sold on campus or through the online shop. Please refer to the uniform price list for further details.

### **BOOK LISTS**

Students in Years 3 - 12 will be provided with book lists prior to the start of the school year. Callows Newsagency in Busselton offers pre-ordering, pre-payment and home delivery. The book lists include stationery and other resources not covered by the resource levies.

### SCHOOL TRIPS & TOURS

GMAS offers students the opportunity to participate in a variety of service, cultural and sporting tours. Attendance is voluntary and the cost varies for each tour. Families must be up to date with their fees in order to attend tours. Information about upcoming tours is listed on our website. Please note that our trips and tours are currently affected by COVID-19 travel restrictions which may continue to affect tours in 2023.

### NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

Families must give a full school term's notice in writing prior to the withdrawal of a student from the school. In default of such notice, one term's fees will be charged.

### OVERDUE ACCOUNTS

Once enrolled, fees and charges must be paid in a timely manner. We encourage families to contact our Bookkeeper if they find themselves unable to make payment by the due date, in order to negotiate a payment plan. If fees are not paid by the due date, and another arrangement is not in place, a 4% balance interest charge will apply whilst the balance remains outstanding.

### **DEBT COLLECTION POLICY**

The school has a debt collection policy which applies to outstanding accounts. This includes provisions for the school to cancel enrolments, engage a debt collection agency or to take legal action to recover any debt owed. Costs including commissions, fees and legal expense are payable by the parents in such circumstances. We prefer to work with our families to manage any financial difficulties in order to preserve the education and wellbeing of our students.
