Pastoral Care

Pastoral care of students at GMAS is paramount and we aim to provide a high level of support to encourage each student to reach his or her full potential. It is important to establish relationships with every student. Each year group has a dedicated Head of Year who works very closely with students and teachers to ensure a high level of pastoral care with ongoing support and encouragement for all students.

Each student belongs to a Home Room group consisting of a Home Room teacher and other students from the same year level. The Home Room teacher is central to the pastoral care of students and is always the first person to approach for help or advice on most matters.

Students also belong to one of six Houses consisting of students from all year levels. The House structure provides opportunities for students to engage in a variety of sporting, academic and cultural competitions. The six Houses are named after local bays in the region: Bunker, Eagle, Flinders, Geographe, Hamelin and Meelup.

The pastoral care team also includes our Chaplain, Psychologist and Learning Support team. 2

The Curriculum

GMAS is committed to providing an educational programme that stimulates natural curiosity whilst also engaging and encouraging students to develop a passion for learning, providing them with a strong foundation of knowledge, skills and strategies required for Senior School and beyond.

The Middle School curriculum is deliberately broad and diverse. Students study the core subjects of English, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Science (HASS) and Science, as well as a breadth of study including Christian Religious Studies (CRS), Health and Physical Education, Japanese, the Technologies (Digital, Foods and Materials) and the Arts (Media Studies, Drama, Music and Visual Arts).

1:1 Laptop Program

Every student in Secondary School has access to their own laptop throughout their learning journey. We believe in the importance of empowering students by educating them to become safe and responsible digital citizens. The ICT Helpdesk is located in the library and staff are on hand to offer technical support during school hours.

Communication

SEQTA is a collaborative communication tool that enables parents and students to engage in the education process. It provides the ability to view timetables, homework, pastoral notes, attendance history, details of upcoming assessments, results, feedback, reports, and communication. Other communications include the school website, a fortnightly newsletter (What's On), a quarterly publication (The Fairlawn), Facebook and other social media platforms.
